You ascended in glory, O Christ our God, granting joy to Your Disciples by the promise of the Holy Spirit. Through the blessing, they were assured that You are the Son of God, the Redeemer of the world! (Tropar of the Feast of the Ascension)

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In between the raindrops we see plants sprouting, flowers budding and freshness in the air that only springtime brings. Isn't it a wonderful creation that God has given us! This time of year also happens to be the period between Pascha and Pentecost with the Feast of the Ascension in between. It is a time of rejoicing as we continue to greet each other with "Christ is Risen" up until the Feast of the Ascension. At the same time we are experiencing a physical and spiritual resurrection. The seeds have been planted in the ground and "died" so that life can sprout, just as Christ died and lay in a tomb and then revealed His resurrection.
